The Museum promotes family-friendly public education through interactive exhibits and artifacts, allowing patrons the opportunity to explore the history and heritage of the Navy SEALs, while honoring the fallen at the Navy SEAL Memorial Wall. The exhibits at the Museum provide an insight into Navy SEAL training; giving visitors an up close look at the formation and application of the Navy SEAL standards of excellence:

The National Navy SEAL Museum was founded in 1985 and honors the Navy SEALs with its location in Fort Pierce, Florida (the training site of the first "Frogmen" of World War II) who established the proud lineage of today's Navy SEAL.

The Navy SEAL Memorial, the only one of its kind dedicated to the Navy SEALs and their predecessors, underscores the Museum's tribute to these warriors.

The names of all who have died in training or service to their country are etched in the granite walls. From the Patrol Boats that enabled Navy SEALs to dominate the rivers and canals in Vietnam to a replica of Osama Bin Laden's compound in Abbottabad, Pakistan; the museum houses an array of artifacts that showcase several perilous SEAL missions and tell the story of their forerunners.



Beyond educational exhibits, the Museum safeguards and shares the legacy of the world's premier special operations force. The Museum not only traces the history of the Navy SEALs, but also provides guests with an uncommon perspective of our nation's constant vigil for freedom spanning more than 70 years. Through their relentless resolve, Naval Special Warriors have "paid the bill" for American freedoms. The Museum helps to shed light on the high cost of this elite preparedness.

The Navy SEALs have protected America's interests in nearly every major military conflict since the Vietnam Conflict. They remain an integral part of the offensive in the ongoing war against terrorism.
